LUNCH PROGRAM

Campers have the choice to bring lunch from home or to participate in the hot lunch program. After camp begins, lunch programs may be changed by contacting the camp office. Beverages, snacks and treats will be provided for all campers. Campers and staff eat lunch in Banner’s air-conditioned dining hall Monday through Thursday. Friday cookout is served in the shaded picnic grove.

HOT LUNCH

Banner hot lunches appeal to the demanding appetites of campers. Lunches **may not** be purchased on a day-to-day basis.

Pre-selected optional lunches offered include a variety of sandwiches (turkey, peanut butter & jelly, organic turkey wrap, bagel & cream cheese), baked potato bar or salad bar. Optional lunches are served with chips and yogurt.

FRIDAY COOKOUT

Campers who bring a sack lunch from home Monday – Thursday may purchase the Friday Cookout.

SACK LUNCH

Campers who bring their lunches must bring them in single-use containers that will be thrown out after lunch. All sack lunches must be labeled with the camper’s name and bench number. Lunches will be collected in the morning and refrigerated. All campers are given a choice of milk, water or lemonade drink with lunch and an ice cream/popsicle treat at the end of the day, regardless of lunch options.



TRANSPORTATION

Door-to-door transportation is included (providing the family lives within Banner's bus boundaries and their home is accessible by school bus). Boundaries are subject to change. Families that are outside of bus service areas are welcome to meet the bus at a central pickup/drop off location.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

A completed application along with a full deposit is necessary to process each camper's registration.

DEPOSITS

Deposits are fully refundable until January 15. After January 15, \$500 of the \$1000 deposit is refundable or transferable. After April 1, the \$1000 deposit is non-refundable and non-transferable.

BALANCE OF TUITION

Balance of fees are due on or before April 1. Banner Day Camp reserves the right to cancel enrollment if fees are not paid by the above date. After April 1, full tuition is due at the time of enrollment.

REFUND POLICY

- **Cancellations prior to January 15**
Full deposits and any tuition paid will be fully refunded.
- **Cancellations after January 15**
\$500 deposit (per camper) is non-refundable and non-transferable. The remaining \$500 deposit (per camper) and any tuition paid will be refunded.
- **Cancellations after April 1**
\$1000 deposit (per camper) is non-refundable and non-transferable. All tuition paid beyond the \$1000 will be refunded.
- **Cancellations after June 1**
Deposits and tuition are non-refundable and non-transferable.

CHANGE OF SESSION

Any enrollment change approved by Banner that results in a reduction of weeks or a change of session after April 1 will result in a \$125 fee. Week changes after June 1 will be considered cancellations and tuition will not be refunded. Please note, holding an 8 week spot does not guarantee space in a 4 week program.

ABSENCE POLICY

Banner Day Camp does not offer make-up days or refunds for camper absences.

PARTICIPATION POLICY

In the event that Banner determines enrollment or continued participation in Banner's program is not appropriate, Banner reserves the right to discontinue service.





MEDICAL INFORMATION

HEALTH FORM

If you have not already done so, please fill out the online Camper Health Form required by the American Camp Association in the Family Login at bannerdaycamp.com. **This form does not need to be filled out by a physician.** Please write the specific date of each immunization or check the "All vaccines are current" box on the back of the health form. The ACA requires the date of your camper's most recent tetanus shot.

MEDICATION AT CAMP

If your camper needs any medication at camp, please notify your Leadership Team member and drop off the medication with a note directed to the infirmary prior to the first day of camp. All medication should be in the original prescription bottle with clear dosage instructions including the time it is needed. The nursing staff will administer medications to your camper only if it is in the original prescription bottle. Feel free to call your age-level leadership to discuss any specific needs.

ALLERGIES

Notify camp of any allergies your camper may have in order to prepare our staff to handle any special dietary needs, medications, EpiPens and Auvi-Qs. Banner will do its best to accommodate any camper with allergies. The severity of a child's allergy may require individual meetings and action plans. Make sure all medications, EpiPen, Auvi-Q, etc. have not expired. All staff will go through training during orientation week on how to manage allergies and administer emergency medication. If you need an EpiPen, Auvi-Q, etc. to travel on the bus, please let camp know and we will make a red pack for the bus.

INFIRMARY

Banner has registered nurses on staff at all times. Banner's nurses will dispense all medications and handle any infirmary needs.

SICK CAMPERS

By sending your child to camp, you are verifying that they are well and not experiencing any illnesses. If your child is sick, they must stay home. They can return to camp:

- After 24 hours being fever free (without medication) or 24 hours after their last incidence of vomiting or diarrhea.
- When other symptoms have improved or are improving.
- When indicated by illness-specific guidance.
- Feel well enough to participate in camp activities.

If you knowingly send your child to camp while sick, Banner reserves the right to discontinue enrollment for your family. Our best defense against contagious illnesses is making sure that campers stay home while sick.

If your camper becomes sick during the camp day, we will notify you. Your camper will need to be picked up within one hour of contacting you. We will not, under any circumstance, send a sick camper home on the bus.



CAMP TRANSPORTATION

Door-to-door transportation is provided for families that live within Banner's bus boundaries and are accessible by school bus. Boundaries are subject to change. Families that are outside of bus service areas are welcome to meet at central pickup/drop off points. Campers will not be able to ride any bus other than their assigned bus.

BUS ROUTE INFORMATION

Approximate pickup and drop off times are emailed home in June. In the afternoon, buses depart from camp by 3:30 pm. Call the camp office with any questions.

BUS ABSENCES

In the event of an absence, call the camp office as soon as possible.

BUS EXPECTATIONS

Campers should:

1

Be ready outside five minutes prior to pickup time.

2

Stay seated on the bus and participate in bus activities.

3

Be kind and friendly to others. Keep hands to oneself.

4

Refrain from screaming or yelling.

5

Keep the bus clean and free of debris.

6

Be ready on deck for drop-off.

LATE ARRIVALS

A camper not riding the morning bus may be dropped off at camp after 9:00 am.

EARLY DEPARTURES

Parents can make arrangements to pick up a camper by sending a bus note or calling the camp office **by 1:00 pm the day prior to the change**. In most cases, your camper will be ready at the front porch at the time requested. Pickups must be completed by 3:00 pm Monday through Thursday and by 2:50 pm on Fridays.



CAMP GEAR

BANNER LOOK

A Banner t-shirt and gym shoes must be worn for all camp activities. Flip flops or sandals are allowed to be worn to and from the pool only. Banner t-shirts should be worn daily. Each camper will receive three complimentary classic logo t-shirts. We recommend having three to five shirts. A store to purchase additional gear is available online [here](#). T-shirts will be mailed to your house prior to the start of camp.



LABELING BELONGINGS

Label all clothing and personal belongings with your camper's full first and last name and bench number. Banner would like to emphasize the importance of labeling all items brought to camp. Every effort will be made to return misplaced items. Towels, swimsuits, shirts, shoes and more can be labeled with a sharpie or name labels can be ordered from [mabelslabels.com](#). Items without names will be donated after a week.

CHANGE OF CLOTHES

(Banner Beginnings and Junior Camp Only)

Pack a complete change of clothes – shirt, pants, socks, and underwear – in a clearly labeled gallon sized ziploc bag. All campers are required to be potty trained by the start of camp, however we realize that accidents do occur. Should accidents become frequent and/or regular, we will call home and discuss a plan with you.

WHAT TO BRING

-  Backpack
-  Sunscreen
-  Extra weather appropriate clothing (sweatshirt/rain jacket)
-  Bathing suit
-  Inexpensive water bottle
-  Flip flops or sandals (for the pool only)

WHAT NOT TO BRING

-  Personal valuables
-  iPod/iPad/iPhones
-  Cell phones
-  Trading cards
-  Glass Containers
-  Any gaming devices (DS, Switch, etc.)
-  Gum
-  Alcohol or drugs
-  Weapons

Banner is not responsible for valuables or collectibles brought to camp.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

SPECIAL EVENT DRESS-UP

Campers are encouraged to dress up for the Friday special events and incorporate your classic Banner t-shirt into your costume. Costumes should be tasteful, appropriate, fun and weather appropriate. Scary and violent costumes and masks are not allowed. See the calendar for the special events schedule and which days allow for dress-up.

RAINY DAY ACTIVITIES

On rainy days, Banner campers continue to enjoy fun activities and programs in the pavilions and other on-site building facilities. Activities include games, crafts, music, sports, dance, and movies.

SUNSCREEN

The majority of our campers' activities will be in Banner's shaded oak groves. During swim and other activities, campers may be in direct sunlight. We recommend applying sunscreen prior to camp each day. If you would like your camper to reapply sunscreen before and after swimming, send it in your camper's swim bag. If you have any additional requests or instructions, please send a note on your Camp Notes pad.

MOSQUITO REPELLING

Banner Day Camp prides itself on ensuring camper's comfort and safety. A professional mosquito abatement service sprays the camp twice weekly at night after the campers have gone home. In the event that mosquitos become problematic, the abatement program will be increased. If you find that your child is still being bitten, we recommend that you apply mosquito repellent at home. If you would like your camper's counselor to reapply repellent after swimming, send it in your camper's swim bag along with a note to the office on your Camp Notes pad.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK

Part of the camping experience involves activities, group arrangements, and interactions that may be new to a child. These experiences come with certain risks and uncertainties beyond what children may be used to dealing with at home. Each family signs an assumption of risk at the time of enrollment stating that they are aware of these risks and are assuming them on behalf of their children. We ask every family to familiarize themselves with and instruct their children on the importance of abiding by Banner's rules and expectations.





COMMUNICATION

COMMUNICATION FROM CAMP

LEADERSHIP PHONE CALLS

Your camper's age level Leadership Team member will be calling home prior to camp and throughout the summer to speak with you about your child's needs and Banner experience.

COUNSELOR ZOOM CALLS

Group counselors will introduce themselves to their campers through a pre-camp zoom call with their group. Counselors will receive their group assignments on Thursday, June 12.

WEBSITE

Visit our website at bannerdaycamp.com to find out about recent activities and upcoming events and to see pictures of campers. Social media updates will help keep you informed on what's happening. Be sure to follow us on Facebook and Instagram.

EMAILS

Banner will email updates and information throughout the summer in addition to weekly emails from your Leadership Team member. Leadership will check email prior to the camp day by 8:50 am and after the buses leave. For urgent and important matters, call the camp office.

TELEPHONE BROADCAST

Banner Day Camp may contact you during the summer with a "Broadcast Message." We use this system to notify you of urgent, time sensitive changes to our program. Caller ID will identify the call as being from Banner Day Camp or 847.295.4900. When answered, a recorded message will play.

ONLINE PHOTOS

You will be receiving an invitation and instructions to view online photo albums to see pictures of your camper at camp. Be sure to check these albums and save any photos you'd like to keep. Albums will be taken down in September.

COMMUNICATION TO CAMP

To best serve your camper's needs, direct any concerns, questions or positive comments to the appropriate Leadership Team member. The Leadership Team members are camp directors who actively participate in the camp program during the hours of 9:00 am-3:30 pm. The optimal time to contact a Leadership Team member is from 8:00 am to 8:50 am and from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm. If you need to get in touch with a member of the Leadership Team during the camp day, call the camp office and the Leadership Team member will return your call in a timely fashion.

OFFICE HOURS

Pre-season office hours are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. During the camp season, office hours are 7:30 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

CAMP NOTES

Prior to camp you will be provided with a yellow Bus Notes pad for transportation needs and a white Camp Notes pad for communicating camper needs to the group counselor. Complete notes thoroughly and clearly and give them to your bus staff.

PHONE CALLS

Banner's Leadership Team welcomes parent phone calls each day. If you need to check in on your camper, call the camp office. Banner's team will get back to you promptly. Call with any question, concern or update.

CODE OF CONDUCT

At Banner, our goal is to create a camp community that is safe and inclusive to each and every one of our campers. We intentionally create experiences that allow our campers to develop important social emotional skills. We recognize that campers will, at times, need redirection and guidance. We always strive to partner with campers and families to make sure that their children are successful at camp. We communicate any challenges that arise and work together to find a solution that is best for the camper and our camp community. It is always our hope that campers can remain at Banner in a way that is safe for them, the other campers and our staff.

Banner Day Camp expects campers to:

- Stay with the group.
 - Campers participating in choice, elective and Tween club programs must:
 - Be at schedule/chosen activities.
 - Meet up on time at the appropriate location.
- Show kindness and respect to other campers and staff.
- Use appropriate language.
- Support and follow the rules and guidelines at all activities and throughout camp.
 - Follow counselor and Leadership directions.
- Keep hands to yourself.
 - Never physically harm yourself or others.
- Respect the belongings of others.
- Take care of the environment.
 - Throw trash away in the appropriate receptacles.
 - Take care of the equipment – including putting it away properly.
 - Respect plants –not climbing on trees, pulling at the branches, picking flowers or plants.

The following behaviors are not allowed at Banner:

- Running from the group.
- Yelling at other campers – being verbally aggressive in tone and/or words.
- Hitting, kicking, biting, or any other inappropriate physical behavior.
- Threatening any physical behavior.

- Using language that is inflammatory and/or inappropriate.
 - Using language that is derogatory to others, prejudiced, sexual or racial in nature.
 - Making jokes that are sexual, racial, or inappropriate in any other way.
 - Using language that is unkind.
- Signs, words or actions that make other campers or staff feel unsafe, uncomfortable or threatened.
- Taking the belongings of others.
- Teasing, mocking and making fun of others.
- Not listening to the staff directions.

Should a camper display behaviors that are challenging at camp, we will take the following steps with the goal of helping the camper be successful at Banner.

- Leadership and staff have conversation with the camper.
- Leadership call home to make parent aware of behaviors at camp.
- Continued/consistent behavior challenges – Include Tylee, our Inclusion Specialist, to make an appropriate behavior plan – communicate plan with families.
- Required break at camp – time away from group, opportunity to learn coping skills and get grounded.
- Required time off of camp –half day, full day, no bus – dependent on behavior.
 - For most behaviors, campers are asked to take a day off of camp after three occurrences.
 - Some more significant behaviors might be required after the first offense.
- Removal from camp.

There are certain aggressive and egregious behaviors that cannot be tolerated at Banner. These behaviors may require an immediate removal from our camp community.

FAQs

1 WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD BRING TO CAMP EACH DAY?

Campers should wear a Banner t-shirt and gym shoes every day. We encourage campers to apply sunscreen in the morning and sunscreen will be reapplied after swimming. Pack a backpack with a swimsuit, pool shoes, and extra sunscreen. Camp will provide a swim towel or one can be brought from home. Please label all items and leave all valuables and electronics at home.

2 WHAT IF MY CAMPER WILL BE ABSENT FROM CAMP?

Please call the camp office right away. If no one is available, please leave a message. We will contact your camper's bus driver to notify them of your absence.

3 WHAT IS THE LATEST TIME I CAN PICK UP MY CAMPER FROM CAMP?

Campers can be picked up by 3:00 pm at the latest. If you would like to pick up your child, please notify the camp office by **sending a bus note by 1:00 pm the day prior to the change.**

4 CAN MY CAMPER RIDE ANOTHER BUS HOME?

No, campers will not be able to ride any bus other than their assigned bus.

5 DOES MY CAMPER'S SACK LUNCH GET REFRIGERATED?

Yes! Sack lunches are separated by group and stored in the walk-in refrigerator each day. Campers who bring their lunches must bring them in single-use containers that will be thrown out after lunch.

6 WHAT DOES BANNER DO IF IT RAINS?
Banner has sufficient space and programming options to provide an excellent camp day even in inclement weather.

7 WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CAMPER LEAVES SOMETHING AT CAMP?
Please notify us immediately if you are missing any items and will do our best to get that item returned home. Please label all belongings with your camper's full name and bench number.

8 MY CHILD IS WORRIED ABOUT SWIM LESSONS THIS SUMMER. WHAT SHOULD I DO?
Banner wants your camper to have every possible success. Please inform us of any apprehensions or negative experiences your camper has had with water so that we can best meet their needs.

9 CAN MY CHILD WEAR GOGGLES IN THE POOL?
Yes. Campers may bring their own goggles to wear in the pool. Please be sure to label them with your camper's name. Banner does not provide goggles due to risk of eye infections.

10 CAN MY CHILD WEAR EARPLUGS IN THE POOL?
Yes. Send earplugs and a small storage case labeled with the camper's name and bench number with your camper. Banner provides storage for earplugs at the pool throughout the summer so your child does not need to worry about losing or misplacing his or her earplugs.

11 MY CHILD WON'T BE SWIMMING TODAY. WHO DO I NOTIFY?
Send a note to the office on your Camp Notes pad. You can also let your Leadership Team member know via email or phone call.

12 HOW IS THE SWIM PROGRAM AFFECTED BY INCLEMENT WEATHER?
If it is raining or if the weather is cool, campers will take part in alternate activities during their scheduled swim time. If it is extremely hot, campers will have a double swim consisting of one instructional swim in the morning and one recreational swim in the afternoon.

13 WHEN CAN I VISIT MY CAMPER AT CAMP?
Banner is a closed campus for the safety and security of the campers and staff. We are always available to connect by phone or email and will continue to share pictures via online photo albums for you to see your camper in action.

14 SHOULD I TIP OR GIVE A GIFT TO THE STAFF?
Tipping or giving a gift to the staff that work with your child(ren) is optional. Many parents like to do so at the completion of camp, which is very much appreciated by the staff. Banner utilizes a platform called Grazzee to make tipping easy for parents and to keep tips earned secure for staff. Watch for more info to come.
