RESPECT

Be considerate of everyone in your words and actions. Show admiration for the abilities, qualities, achievements and traditions of others.

FRIENDSHIP

Be caring, supportive and kind to one another. Be inclusive and recognize the good in others. Show mutual trust and share together.

I BELIEVE IN MYSELF (PERSEVERANCE)

Remember Banner's Motto: "It may be hard, it may take time. But stick with it, and you'll be fine. You can do it!" Be willing to continue on and persevere when the task becomes difficult. Have faith in yourself.

LEADERSHIP TEAM MEMBER PHONE CALLS

Members of the Banner Leadership Team will begin calling all camp families in June. The Leadership Team member that will be overseeing your camper(s)' group will be calling home sometime before the start of camp to welcome you to Banner and begin learning about your camper(s).

The Banner Day Camp Leadership Team includes more than 40 dedicated educators and camp professionals working together to give campers an extraordinary Banner summer. All Leadership Team members have extensive professional experience in education and child development.

Each age-level and specialty area has multiple Leadership Team members responsible for working with campers and staff. Every age-level is then broken down into much smaller pods supervised by a Leadership Team member. This structure allows members of the Leadership Team to work with their specific groups continually throughout the camp day.

Leadership Team members are responsible for supervising all staff members and camp activities as well as ongoing parent communication. Please feel free to contact your Leadership Team member anytime throughout the summer if you have any questions or information about your child that you would like to share with camp.
